The beams of blue light arranged in the shape of the Twin Towers are visible for 60 miles on a clear night. For the best views, head to Washington Square and Union Square parks in Manhattan, Gantry Plaza State Park in Queens, Brooklyn Bridge Park and the Staten Island Ferry Terminal.

Bell of Hope

The annual tradition of ringing the Bell of Hope at St. Paul's Chapel on 9/11 began in 2002 when the Lord Mayor of London Sir Michael Oliver presented the city with the gift, which was forged in the same foundry as the Liberty Bell. Attend the bell-ringing ceremony in remembrance of the fallen.

"Rendering the Unthinkable"

The National September 11 Memorial & Museum unveils its first exhibition featuring 13 NYC artists who've contributed paintings, sculptures, clips and pieces created from paper that rained down from the falling towers.

New York City Fire Museum Memorial Service

The museum honors the 343 firefighters who sacrificed their lives in the tragedy. View the black marble-and-tile memorial with images of each firefighter and the bunker coat and helmet of FDNY Chaplain Mychal Judge, the first recorded victim of the attacks.

National September 11 Memorial Ceremony

Families of the victims gather for a reading of the names and moments of silence marking when the planes struck the WTC, the Pentagon, when the towers fell and when the fourth plane crashed in Pennsylvania.
